Introduction

University of Bolton Security Services Strategy provides a framework for managing the security of the campus, staff, students, and visitors. The strategy will minimise risks and ensure the University has systems, policies, procedures, and measures in place so that all users of the campus can conduct their activities in a safe and secure environment.

Purpose

To undertake security activities and be able to contribute to the consistent delivery of a first-class security service provided by the University, and to maintain a safe and secure environment, which then enables the Security Services department to prevent crime and anti-social behaviour whilst keep students, staff, contractors, and visitors safe from harm.

To achieve this by proactively responding to threats, risks, and harm, which includes understanding of the University incident command and control and by engaging with debriefing for continuous improvement purposes, executing daily operational security tasks, escalating appropriately, and working to best practice standards.

<u>Values</u>

Respect –This means respecting each other, excellent communication, valuing contributions, respecting differences, and supporting one another.

Collaboration - This is all about teamwork and remembering that we are all working towards the same goal. It is also about how we work with our clients and their other suppliers. We are one team!

Job Specification

- Patrol premises regularly to maintain order and establish presence.

- Checking visitors in and out of the area.

- Escorting visitors around the premises.
- Ensuring compliance with government regulations

The University Security Strategy sets out the strategic imperative that security arrangements are in place that provide a visible deterrent, ensure a safe, secure environment whilst as an 'open' access HEI enabling work and study to continue with the minimum amount of disruption Security services are expected to deliver a comprehensive, proactive and customer-focused service, prioritizing the safety and security of all campus users, buildings and assets on a number of sites across Bolton.

To assist this the University is seeking 3 suitable individuals to operate as Security officers managing delivery of services across a number of sites on a 24/7 rota basis. The need to be vigilant, visible and approachable is essential in prioritising the safety of our stakeholders and assets

The ability to be flexible regarding working hours and a customer service focus are essential. Good interpersonal skills and a professional, courteous approach are essential requirements for these roles.
