

ALTERNATIVE GRADUATION PRIVACY NOTICE

The University of Bolton's Alternative Graduation ceremonies are significant events for our graduates and our staff. These ceremonies are events where official photography are taken and film footage captured which will later be released online to the public, therefore there is no expectation of privacy under data protection legislation for any attendees. This privacy notice explains how the University will process personal data for and during the event.

This privacy notice applies to all graduating students at the University of Bolton who are intending to graduate or may be eligible for an award, whether they attend an Alternative Graduation ceremony or not, and staff. Please note the following important information:

During the Alternative Graduation Ceremony

- If you graduate in person your name and award title will be read out at the Alternative Graduation ceremony immediately prior to you walking across the front of the Deane Lecture Theatre stage.
- Your photograph will be taken at the point that you receive your 'scroll' from the University representative (usually the Head of School).
- The University's official photographer(s) that include William Northam will take generic shots at the University.
- For individual shots off "stage" the photographer will seek your consent before taking the photograph. You should advise the photographer before any photograph is taken if you do not wish to be photographed.
- All Alternative Graduation ceremonies will be recorded (including backstage footage) by The Chase Films and edited to create Graduation Documentary Films which will be released at a later date.
- Photographs submitted by you (if you cannot attend your Alternative Graduation Ceremony) will be edited into the Graduation Documentary Films.
- Television companies may be present to interview our honorary graduands and other VIPs. **If you do not wish to appear on television, you should maintain your distance from any filming that may take place.**
- Film recordings and photographs of these events may be used to market and promote the activities of the University of Bolton and these may appear in any of our promotional materials, in printed or electronic format, including the University website, press, social media, multimedia productions, course leaflets or prospectuses.
- Information relating to disability, access needs and special arrangements will only be used to make reasonable adjustments at the ceremonies. The University may, if necessary, appoint a specialist to ensure that students requiring alternative arrangements receive tailored support. We will discuss your requirements with you upon receiving a request and if necessary, with your consent, we may share information with the appointed specialist on the day of your ceremony so that they

are able to support you as necessary. This information will not be shared with any other department within the University and will be deleted from our records after the Alternative Graduation ceremonies.

- All personal data will be processed in accordance with the Data Protection Act 2018 and UK General Data Protection Regulation.

Online Graduation Ceremony Programme

- Your student name will be listed underneath your award title and subject within the Alternative Graduation ceremony programme published online by the University. The programme will be published to all those who participate in an Alternative Graduation either in person or by submitting a photograph.

Graduation Documentary Films

- Your film footage/photograph submitted along with your student name, award title and subject will be used within the Graduation documentary Film.
- Film footage from backstage at your Alternative Graduation ceremony along with University classroom scenes and other on campus filming will be included in the Graduation Documentary Films in which you could appear.

Purpose for processing	Managing the administrative process in organising graduation ceremonies, conferring awards on graduands and documenting the event for the purposes of celebrating graduands achievements. Marketing and promotion of the University.
Legal basis for processing	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Public Task: Article 6(1)(e), performance of a task in the public interest/exercise of official duty vested in the University. 2. Legitimate Interests: Article 6(1)(f), processing personal data for the purposes of photography and filming for marketing and promotion of the University. It is in the interests of both the University and graduands involved to document these occasions which are important life events. 3. Consent: Article 6(1)(a), processing personal data in relation to individual or smaller group photographs for marketing and promotion of the University. Sharing information with an appointed third party specialist support provider.
Whose information is being collected	Students, University employees and all other ceremony attendees.
What information is collected	Name, identifying numbers, address, contact details, educational details, access requirements or reasonable adjustments that may be needed, photographs and film images.
Who is the information being collected from	Students used to arrange the event is collected from information provided directly by them and information created by the University during the course of students' studies. Images and personal data collected by photographic and film cameras is collected during the course of the event.
How is the information being collected	University systems for the event organisation and images by camera on the day of the event.

Who we share personal data with	Suppliers contracted to design and print the graduation programme, take photographs, film the Alternative Graduation ceremony, and publish online and in any of the University's promotional materials, in printed or electronic format. The University official gown suppliers to confirm the appropriate gown for your award. Specialist support providers.
How secure is the information	All personal data is kept securely on University server in line with the University Information Security Policies available at: https://www.bolton.ac.uk/about/governance/documents/#dataprotection
Who keeps the information updated	Students are required to keep their information up to date during the course of their studies to ensure that the personal data used at the time of graduation ceremonies is accurate, as this will be recorded at this point as a record of the event.
