Here at the University of Bolton, we are proud of our growing reputation as a student focussed University. With our strategy of "Teaching Intensive, Research Informed" we are committed to offering our students the best experience possible. Due to our ongoing growth, we are now looking for a Wellbeing Advisor to join our Student Services, Library and Sport team.

The University of Bolton is investing significantly in its Mental Health care and Wellbeing services for students by improving service provision and by educating staff and students to raise awareness. This fulltime role is a key addition to Student Services and the Life Lounge and its introduction compliments the department's current working practices and proposed development of new initiatives.

The University of Bolton Student Services department opened the Life Lounge in September 2015 and received Customer Service Excellence Plus for the initiative. The Life Lounge provides students with access to a Counselling service, Cognitive Behavioural Therapy Service and a Mental Health Advisor service. The University of Bolton published its Student Mental Health and Wellbeing Strategy 2021-2026 in 2021 and later in the same academic year it published its Suicide Prevention and Response Strategy 2021-2026.

We are now looking for a Project Officer who will support the Senior Wellbeing Coordinator with the implementation of the 5-year strategy, building long-term plans to enhance the student experience and address potential risks associated by the death of a student.

Successful candidates will be working closely with professional colleagues and other specialist staff including but not limited to Disability Advisors, Mental Health Advisors, Counsellors, Cognitive Behavioural Therapists and external stakeholders.

The successful candidate will possess strong administrative skills, credible project management experience, data interrogation and evaluation skills and will need to understand and have awareness of mental health and wellbeing issues associated with young people and adults. In order to meet the needs of the University and Student Services, a flexible approach to working patterns/hours is an essential requirement of this role.
