The greenhouse has had a clear out and I have potted on my tomatoe plants into their final positions in the greenhouse. I have been starting to harden off my summer bedding plants in preparation for planting out into the garden beds, pots and hanging baskets as well. ## Spring Flowers

### Jobs to be doing in the garden

Prune spring flowering shrubs such as Forsythia, Choisya and Ribes after flowering.

Regularly hoe off weeds from flower beds and vegetable patches.

Start to mow lawns weekly now as the temperature warms up.

Lift and divide overcrowded clumps of Daffodils and other spring flowering bulbs.

As summer is nearly upon us a lot of the vegetables and flowers I have been growing from seed will soon be ready to plant out.

Broad Bean varieties I have sown this year are "The Sutton" and "Crimson Flowered". These will hopefully not only give me a good crop of tasty beans, but the delicate flowers of the plants will also be a welcome addition to the garden.

Runner Bean varieties I have sown this year are "Scarlett Emperor" and "BenchMaster". I will be trying to grow some extra long pods with the "Benchmaster" variety, so will keep you updated through the summer months on how I get on with growing them.

I always like to grow a lot of French Marigolds as they give an abundance of yellow, orange and red coloured flowers throughout the summer and the Bees love them. Varieties I have grown this spring include "Bonita Mixed", "Red Cherry" and "Queen Sophia".
