## How Your Fees Help Fund Your Degree

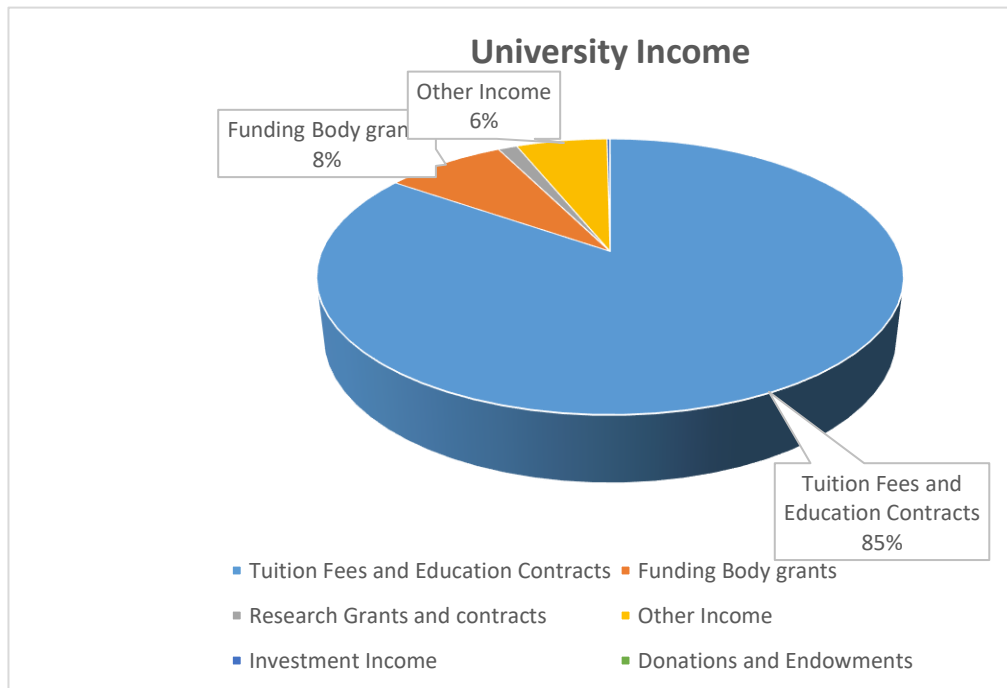

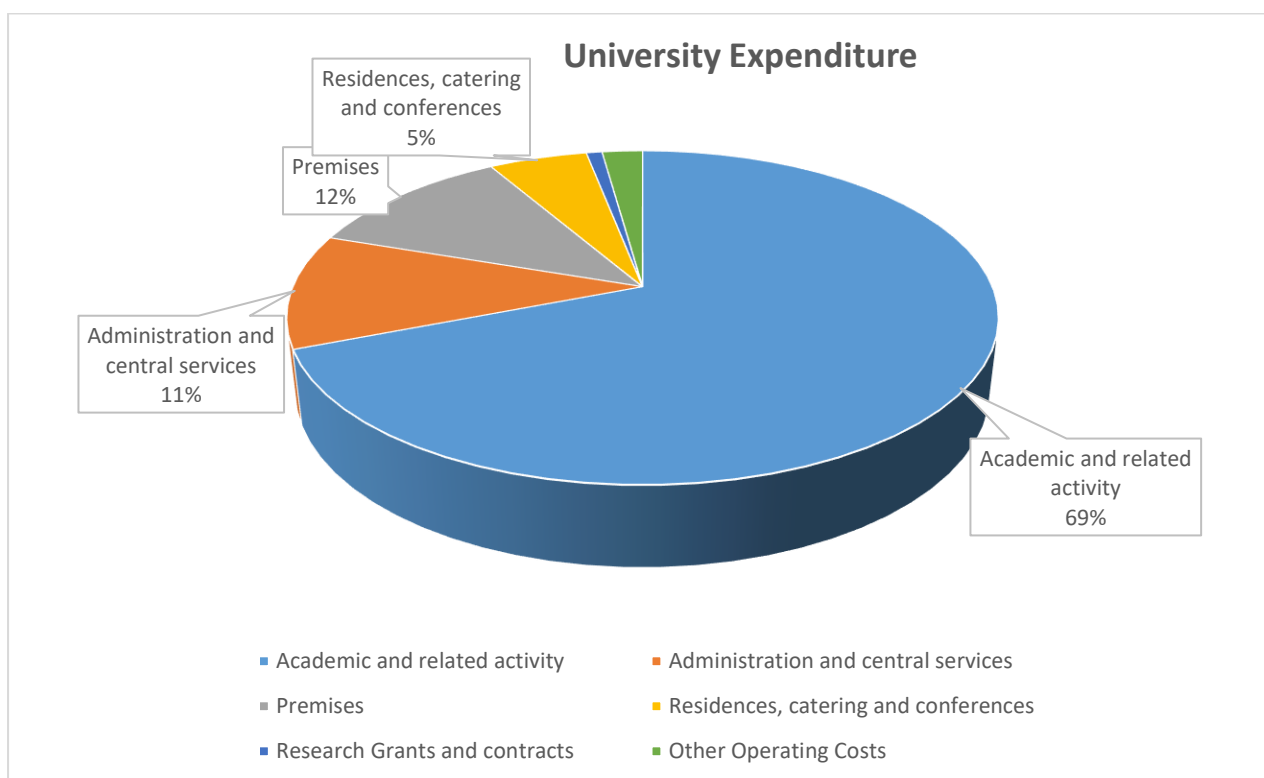
