

MARKING CRITERIA

Save Our Ocean, Protect Our Future – Competition

Regardless of whether you choose to write an essay or choose to produce an A1 poster/commentary, entrants are expected to provide a balanced answer which covers equally all three questions mentioned in the topic title.

Essay Entry
