

Course team

Work Experience

It is particularly important that you are able to develop your practical and professional skills in working with children alongside your academic study

The more experience you get the better! This will make you more employable when you complete the course

It is your responsibility to secure a placement which will begin in Semester 2 of Year 1

Placements will be for a minimum of 2 days a week



Entry Requirements

72 UCAS points

5 GCSE passes C or above, including English

Students are required to secure a work placement before the end of Semester 1 Year 1



Employment

Your experience in your placements is invaluable not just in developing your practical skills but also for networking which may lead to employment

Work in the day-care sector with opportunities for supervisory and leadership roles

Teaching support worker in the primary sector

Opportunities within multi-professional teams working with young children and their families



Career prospects

Nursery settings: Room leader, deputy manager, manager

Primary teacher: You would need to complete a PGCE following the Childhood Studies degree. (It is a requirement that you also have English, Maths and Science GCSEs at C or above.)

Early Years Teacher (EYT): You would complete an assessment following your degree that would give you the status of Early Years Teacher within the day-care sector
