

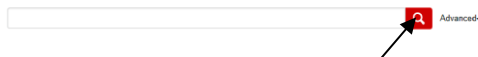


Discover@Bolton is the Library's search engine. It allows you to search multiple databases (collections of journals) and the Library catalogue at once via a single search interface. The full-text content of both journal articles and ebooks is accessible via Discover@Bolton. The availability and location of print books and other material in the Library is also shown.

Discover@Bolton enables cross-searching of the majority of our databases such as ProQuest, CINAHL, SportDISCUS, ScienceDirect, HeinOnline, Emerald and ICE\*. A number of open access sources are also included, such as the University of Bolton Institutional Repository (UBIR).

Type your keyword or topic (or title if you know what you are looking for) in the search box, e.g., **b2b marketing**,

and click on the search button.

You will then see a list of results, which will include a mixture of resources, such as books, journal articles, newspaper articles, theses, etc. The type of resource is shown under the title and author/publication details, such as eBook, Book, Journal Article, etc.

Use the filters on the left of the screen to refine or sort your results. You can refine to full-text only or by item type, subject area or publication date. For example, to restrict your results to ebooks only, click **Full Text Online** and **Book/eBook**.

The results shown are from the Library's subscriptions, to extend your search beyond that, choose the "Check this box to search open access resources beyond your library's collection" option at the top of the results list to include additional open access resources.

\*Note that not all databases are included, eg. Lexis Library and Westlaw

Discover@Bolton will provide a definition of your search term: look out for the information on the right of the screen. Where available, this will be from one of our reference databases. If this isn't available, the definition will be sourced from Wikipedia - please check with your tutor as to its acceptability as a quotable reference.

You will also see **Related Topics** which may be useful. Click on a suggested topic to see an alternative list of results.
