Postgraduate Funding 2020/21

Before undertaking a postgraduate course of study it is best to consider how you could fund it. Obtaining funding for postgraduate courses can be difficult. The level of support which you may have experienced at undergraduate level is not available for further study. Postgraduate students therefore normally fund their studies through a number of different options.

Research Councils

You are recommended to apply for funding from Research Councils 1.5 to 2 years before commencement of your course of study.

Research Councils are government funded councils who as part of their remit are responsible for postgraduate funding.

There are 7 councils and the competition for grants is intense. Only a few applicants are successful.

Usually the Councils themselves do not accept direct applications from individual postgraduates though this is not always the case. Research Councils tend to allocate funding to individual departments and institutions and you should enquire directly to the department in the institution in which you want to study.

Institutional Funding

Most institutions across the UK operate their own bursary and scholarship schemes. This is usually set to the institution's own set criteria and usually changes on a yearly basis. Applications are made to the relevant department if an award is available.

University Student Support Fund

For U.K. students. The maximum award available through the Student Support Fund for postgraduate students is £500. In addition to being shown to have a shortfall of income students must have made realistic provisions to support their tuition fees and living costs. The award cannot be used to meet the cost of tuition fees for any postgraduate student.

Alumni Loyalty Discount

The Alumni Loyalty Discount, a tuition fee waiver of £1,000, will be awarded to fulltime and part-time U.K. and E.U. Masters students, irrespective of their financial means, who progress to a University of Bolton Taught Masters Course, having first completed an undergraduate Higher Education or PGCE/PGDE/PDE/Cert Ed course of study at University of Bolton. You must also have registered to become a member of the Bolton Alumni and Friends Association (BAFA). Available for full 180 credit masters courses only.

Taught Masters Excellence Scholarship

The Masters (Taught) Excellence Scholarship is available to full-time U.K., EU and International Masters students, irrespective of their financial means, who progress to a University of Bolton Taught Masters Course, having attained a First Class Honours degree from a U.K. or E.U. institution. Available for full 180 credit masters courses only. There will be a maximum of three awards made in the 2020/21 academic year, paid as a tuition fee waiver of £1,500. Disabled Students Allowance (DSA)

Students with disabilities may be eligible to receive DSA which can provide funding towards the cost of equipment, support tutors, travel and other course related costs.

Postgraduate Loan Scheme

Students commencing a taught or research 180 credit Masters course from September 2020 may be able to apply for a loan from the Student Loans Company of up to £11,222. The loan will be paid directly to the student. To apply students must be aged under 60 and be a resident of England or the E.U. Postgraduate Doctoral Loan Scheme

Students commencing on an eligible Postgraduate Doctoral course from September 2020 or later may be able to apply for a loan from the Student Loans Company. The maximum amount of Postgraduate Doctoral loan available for 2020/21 is £26,445 for the duration of the course. The loan will be paid direct to the student. Loans are available for full stand-alone Postgraduate Doctoral courses only. Course duration must be 3-8 academic years. The course can be full or part-time. To apply students must aged under 60 and be a resident of England or the E.U. Further information is available:

Employer

The majority of students will supplement their studies with working part time and a large proportion will study part time so that they can maintain their full time careers and levels of income.
